What will you be up to?

- To help in the set up and tidying up of the high quality informal learning activities across our SBT sites.
- With an interactive approach to delivery, to engage visitors with the activities on offer.
- To share information with visitors about the Trust's collections, such as current and future exhibitions and activities.
- To provide visitors with information on other SBT sites, events, current and forthcoming.
- To set up informal learning spaces and to clear and pack away at the end of each session.
- To share responsibility for keeping cupboards and storage areas tidy.
- To lead small group work.
- To encourage visitors to fill in the feedback questionnaire.
- To aid in the evacuation of the site if required.

Do you have the skills we are looking for?

- Experience of, or an interest in, working with children.
- A desire to bring Shakespeare and New Place to life for visitors.
- Good people skills with the ability to talk confidently to both individuals & groups from different age groups, varying backgrounds and with a range of needs. If you can do this in a second language, even better!
- Enthusiasm for delivering craft-based or practical learning activities.
- Willingness to learn and share with visitors the points of interest at New Place.
- Willingness to undergo training in facilitation, working with families, customer service, access issues and health and safety as appropriate.
- Ability to ensure health and safety guidelines are followed and be responsible for your own health and safety.
- You may be asked to undertake a DBS check as part of this role.

How often would we like you to volunteer?

A regular commitment if possible of either one full day each weekend or one day a week during school holidays.

- Volunteer badges will be provided.
- Smoking is not allowed on site.
- Food is not allowed on site.
- Training will be provided as necessary.

- Annual service award each February for volunteers who have achieved 200 hours or more of volunteering in the previous year.
