## Language

greasy - adj., covered with fat or oil

bunch-backed - adj., with an abnormally curved back

canker-blossom - n., a small worm that eats flowers

hideous – adj., ugly, disgusting

clay-brained - adj., slow, stupid

clotpole - n., stupid person

knavish – adj., dishonest, lying

dog-hearted - adj., cruel

dogfish – n., a kind of small shark, very common in Shakespeare's time

peevish - adj., silly, foolish

eye-offending - adj., ugly

hedge-pig – n., a small animal with spikes on its back:

rank – adj., stinking

horn-mad – adj., furious, angry

ruffian – n., a strong and violent person (especially a man) who threatens

and hurts other people

saucy – adj., rude usually in a playful way

lily-livered – adj., without courage, a coward

**jack-a-nape** – n., monkey

waggish – adj., playful, full of trouble

muddy-mettled – adj., slow in thinking

rabbit-sucker – n., a baby rabbit

yeasty – adj., superficial, not serious about things

sour-faced - adj., having a bad-tempered facial expression

rudesby – n., a very impolite (rude) person

fitful – adj. losing your calm quickly

paper-faced - adj. having a face as white as paper

scullion – n., base servant

gnarling – adj., making the sounds of an angry dog

pinch-spotted - adj., full of spots and bruises
