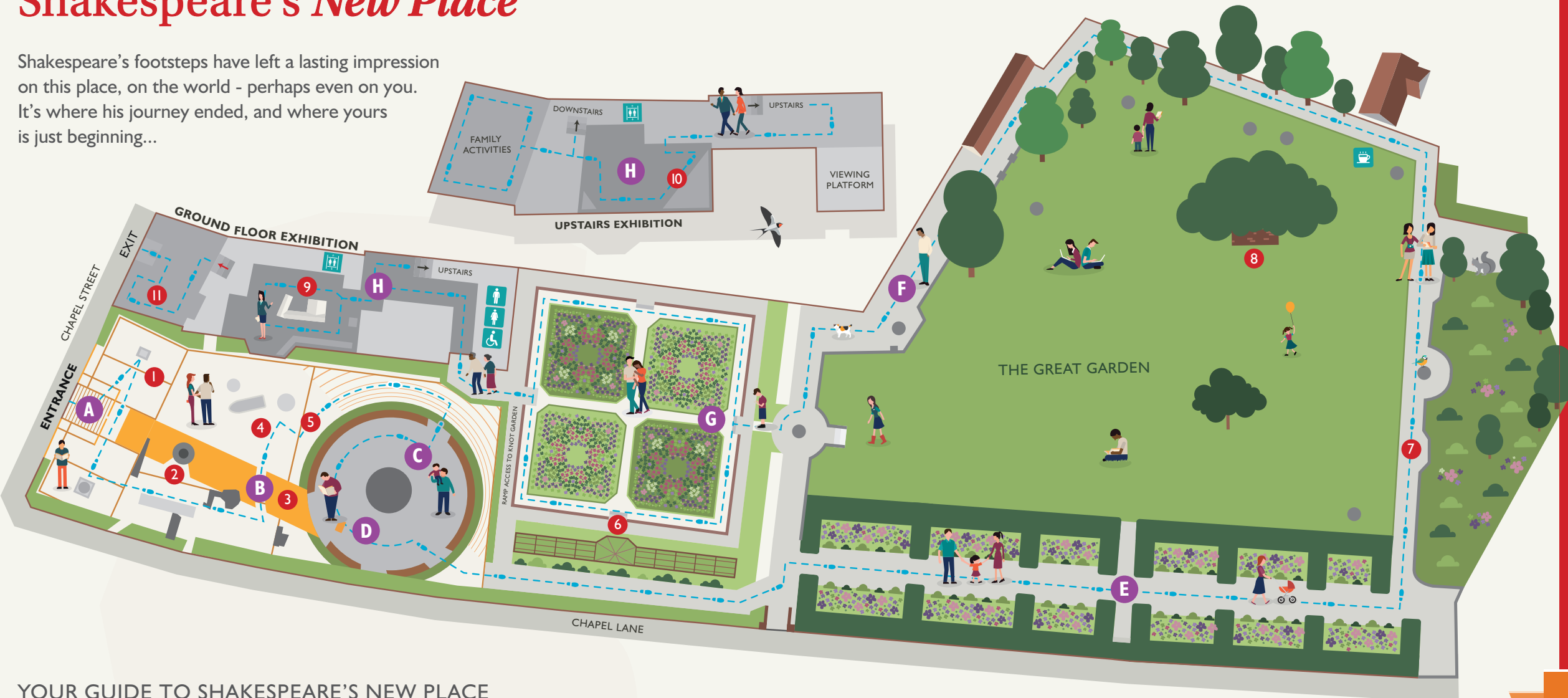


# Shakespeare's *New Place*

Shakespeare's footsteps have left a lasting impression on this place, on the world - perhaps even on you. It's where his journey ended, and where yours is just beginning...

There is so much to discover at Shakespeare's *New Place*

1. **House footprint** - The bronze footprint of Shakespeare's house
2. **Well** - The well that served Shakespeare's household
3. **Play pennants and sonnet ribbon** - These represent the body of Shakespeare's work
4. **The King's Ship** - A 16th century galleon tossed on the high seas of *The Tempest*
5. **Armillary sphere** - A model of the universe with the Earth at the centre
6. **Arbour** - A perfect spot to pause and gaze over the Knot Garden
7. **Wild bank** - Planted with flowers mentioned in Shakespeare's plays
8. **Mulberry tree** - Believed to be grown from a cutting of the tree Shakespeare planted here.
9. **New Place Exhibition** - the history of New Place
10. **Family life** - Learn more about the Shakespeares and their time at New Place
11. **Gift shop & way out** - Take a little bit of Shakespeare's New Place home



## YOUR GUIDE TO SHAKESPEARE'S NEW PLACE

- A The Gatehouse**  
Cross the threshold just where Shakespeare's front door used to be. You are now standing on the site of his family home.
- B Golden Garden**  
Take your time exploring Shakespeare's influence, captured in planting and sculpture.
- C His Mind's Eye**  
This striking sculpture expresses Shakespeare's creativity, and the sheer force of his genius in the world.
- D Shakespeare's Chair and Desk**  
All his incredible works began life at a humble writing desk. Sit in Shakespeare's chair and look out over the site of his final home.
- E Great Garden**  
Beyond the Yew Walk, the beautiful Gregg Wyatt sculptures adorn the Great Garden - the largest surviving area of Shakespeare's estate.
- F Greenwood Tree**  
The leaves of this tree will definitely stand "*winter and rough weather*". Each one is kindly sponsored by supporters of the Trust.
- G Knot Garden**  
Wander through exquisite planting and enjoy the scents and sights, all in keeping with Ernest Law's original 1918 design.
- H Exhibition**  
Step into Shakespeare's world. Discover the part he played in the house's history, and in the town. Immerse yourself in Shakespeare family life.
